In 2010 Daniel Witthaus completed a non-stop, 38-week Beyond 'That's So Gay' national challenging homophobia tour of regional, rural and remote Australia (www.thatssogay.com.au). His aim was to find out what modern day life was like for lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) young people. Daniel also spoke with everyday, non-LGBT people to find out what they really think about it all. After 100s and 100s cups of tea, he'll share what he found out using stories and photos.

For almost 15 years Daniel Witthaus has challenged homophobia in Australia. He developed the" Pride and Prejudice" educational package and trains young people, teachers and health professionals. His work has included locations such as Indonesia, Thailand, Sri Lanka, Germany, Poland, the Netherlands and the United States.
